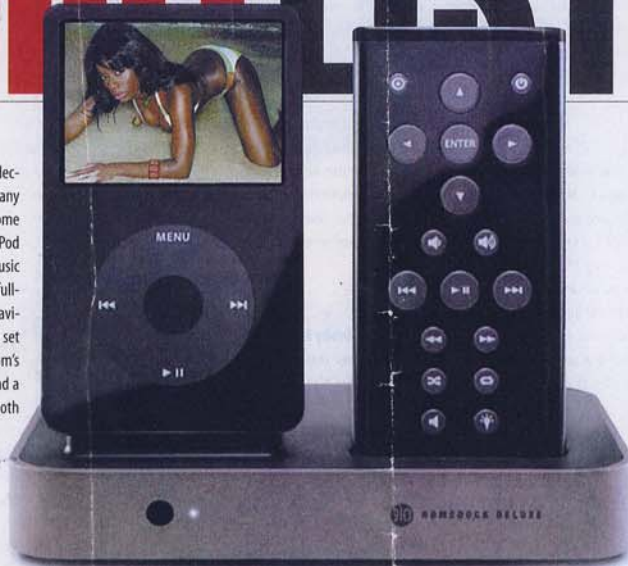


# THE HOT LIST
